





You must select five preferences. You might be allocated to any of these five.


Elective Subject Review - 2024

Year 9 : Response rate 80%


Question 6: From options proposed by the current Student Leaders, select any you would be interested in doing.

Vocational Education and Training

Vocational Education and Training (VET) - Year 10 only

- VET (Vocational Education and Training) courses are practical courses, with a theory component.
- VET qualifications are nationally recognised.
- VET students are highly sort after by employers.
- VET courses are presented by teachers who also have training qualifications.
- Students completing VET courses participate in industry experience.
- Assessment is different in VET courses.
- VET courses are offered to Year 10 students in agreement with Guilford Young College (provider no.1129) as our Registered Training Organisation (RTO).



- Check that you have one with your name on it.
- If you lose this sheet these details can be provided by Student Services.

Web Preferences Access Guide The following steps outline how to enter your subject preferences online. You will need a computer with an internet connection and a printer. Internet Access We recommend using Google Chrome or Firefox. Log in to www.selectmysubjects.com.au/student using: Log In To view your subject information click "View Subject Details" at the top right of Home Page To select/change your preferences, click "Add New Preferences" at the top right of the screen. Select your subjects from the drop down lists, you have 30 minutes to do so. Preference Once complete, click "Proceed". Selection Note: You are not finished yet. If you are happy with your preferences click "Submit Valid Preferences" which will open your "Preference Receipt". Preference Or if you would like to make changes to your preferences click "Cancel" and this Validation will take you back to the Preference Selection page. You can print your "Preference Receipt" by clicking "Open Print View" and clicking "Print Receipt". Preference To continue click "Return to Home Page". If you want to change your Receipt preferences, repeat the process by clicking "Add New Preferences", otherwise exit by clicking "Log Out". End of steps.


Submitted Preference Receipts

You can log in and enter/change your subject preferences up to three times.



Please print the receipt for your subjects. Sign it and return to Student services.

Remember:

- Select subjects that Interest you and subjects you are good at.
- Be realistic is the subject at the right challenge level for you?
- Balance your workload seek a challenge but do not overwhelm yourself.
- Consider your possible future Pathway choose subjects that can support your Pathway or if you are unsure keep your options open by choosing broad and diverse subjects.
- DO NOT PICK elective subjects because your friends are picking them,
 or based on the hope a particular teacher may take the class.

Pathways to Year 11 and 12?

- Compulsory subjects in Years 9 and 10 provide a firm foundation for Senior Secondary subjects.
- In most cases, not studying a particular Year 9 or Year
 10 elective won't mean that you can't do that subject or related subjects in Years 11 & 12
- It is a good idea to continue some subjects through years 9 & 10 if you wish to choose those subject in Years 11 and 12. Ask subject teachers or Heads of Department for more information.



When will Elective Subjects be Finalised?

All five preferences are important.

The order of your subject choices matters.

There is no advantage to submitting your choices early.

• You must get them in by Monday July 29 if you don't want to miss out!

Elective Subjects will be finalised in Term Three.
